Paper – II : STUDY FROM NATURE (Practical)

Medium: Pencil and colour Size: Half Imperial Exam: DISPLAY

A pot with plant/flowers/Fruits should be arranged against drapery background with a flat foreground. This paper also includes study of fruits and vegetable etc.

Practical paper shall have one session of three hours.

- (a) 1 plates of pencil shading and 2 plates of water colour.
- (b) A sketch book of not less than 10 sketches.

Note: EoSE Display of Plates prepared will be done and marking will be done by the External Examiner appointed by the University. Internal Exam / CA marking will be by the Internal Examiner done on the basis of Submission

Submission work will be retained till the declaration of the result and returned to the Candidate by the Department thereafter. If no claim is made within two months of the declaration of the result, the submission will be destroyed.

Note:

- (a) Candidate should pass in theory as well as in practical paper separately.
- (b) There should be minimum Four hours for the regular study of Practical including one hour for sketching.
- (c) Minimum three demonstrations should be arranged by the subject expert during the session for each practical paper.
- (d) The Department should also arrange for an Educational tour to Ancient Art centres like Ajanta, Ellora, Elephanta, Khajuraho, Mahabalipuram etc. once a year.
- (e) Practical examination will be conducted at the centres and the practical work will be examined examiner. The examiner will examine the answer books in consultation with and internal examiner who is the subject teacher of the Department of Drawing and Painting. University may centralize the practical examinations at few well equipped Departments to hold examination economically.

Paper – II : RENDERING OF NATURE (Practical)

Medium : Any medium Size : Half Imperial Exam: Display

Two dimensional design of Nature should be made giving emphasis on stylisation, colour-scheme and texture etc.

- (a) 3 plates of creative design.
- (b) A sketch book of not less than 10 sketches.

Note: EoSE Display of Plates prepared will be done and marking will be done by the External Examiner appointed by the University. Internal Exam / CA marking will be by the Internal Examiner done on the basis of Submission

Submission work will be retained till the declaration of the result and returned to the Candidate by the Department thereafter. If no claim is made within two months of the declaration of the result, the submission will be destroyed.

Note:

- (a) Candidate should pass in theory as well as in practical paper separately.
- (b) There should be minimum Four hours for the Practical paper including one hour for sketching.
- (c) Minimum three demonstrations should be arranged by the subject expert during the session for each practical paper.
- (d) The Department should also arrange for an Educational tour to Ancient Art centres like Ajanta, Ellora, Elephanta, Khajuraho, Mahabalipuram etc. once a year.
- (e) Practical examination will be conducted at the centres and the practical work will be examined external examiner. The examiner will examine the answer books in consultation with and internal examiner who is the subject teacher of the Department of Drawing and Painting. University may centralize the practical examinations at few well equipped Departments to hold examination economically.

MULTIDISCIPLINARY SEMESTER-V

Paper I: Folk and Tribal Art of India(Practical)

Students have to make two paintings from the following art forms:-Folk Art -Rajasthani Mandana, Madhubani, Phad Art Tribal Art -Gond Art and Warli Art



The student is required to **select any one art** form from the above mentioned arts forms. Student have to make two paintings based on the elements of the Art Form chosen by the student. Student can make paintings on either canvas/ paper. Emphasis should be given on depicting the indigenous style of Folk and Tribal Art Form chosen. Student must understand the compositional values, colour scheme, creative and representation aspect of Form and Technique of the Folk Art and Tribal Art.

Size of the painting: 1/2 Imperial size

Medium: Water/Poster/ Acrylic etc.

Exam: Display

Submission: 02 Paintings from the selected art form.

Scheme of Examination: Evaluation shall be done by exhibiting the sessional practical works at the end of the Semester. Marking will be done by the External Examiner appointed by the University. Internal Exam/CA marking will be done by the Internal Examiner on the basis of Submission.

Submission work will be retained till the declaration of the result and returned to the Candidate by the Department thereafter. If no claim is made within two months of the declaration of the result, the submission will be destroyed.

Paper II: Relief Mural Art (Practical)

Relief Mural art is to be created from any durable material like Paper Mache, Ceramics, any mineral powder with adhesive, Metal sheet and wire, Wood, Fiber glass or any type of plastic material, scrap etc.

A student should focus on compositional value and handling varied material in figurative/semi figurative style or Abstract or Creative style.

Size of the Mural should not exceed 16"×24"

Exam: Display

Submission: 02 plates.

Scheme of Examination: Evaluation shall be done by exhibiting the practical work done during the session at the end of the Semester. Marking will be done by the External Examiner appointed by the University. Internal Exam / CA marking will be done by the Internal Examiner on the basis of Submission.

Submission work will be retained till the declaration of the result and returned to the Candidate by the Department thereafter. If no claim is made within two months of the declaration of the result, the submission will be destroyed.
